A WEEKEND FOR BIG FIELDS

With our course improving from the recent renovations and good spring weather over 300 competitors turned out for an enjoyable weekend of golf. The fields were boosted by over twenty visitors from Windsor Country Club who journeyed north to compete in the annual Maitland Windsor Challenge held with Saturdays club competition and also the Mait/Wind Cup, brainchild of ex Windsor now

Maitland resident Pat Maher, held in conjunction with our regular Sunday competition. Thanks go to Pat and Phil Maher for their initiative and enthusiasm.

Saturday saw an incredible field of 253 golfers compete in the Lynn McIntyre Memorial Stableford Competition, although boosted by the Windsor golfers, a fitting tribute for our popular ex member and his family.

Dave Curry provided the best round in A Grade with 39 points just finishing ahead of Windsor's Chad Nelson, by countback, also scoring 39 points. Third position went to Darren McKenzie with 37 points from Simon Rutherford, 37 points, fourth and Matt Whitmore in fifth place with 36 points.

In B Grade Windsor visitor took the benefit of the countback on 38 points to take home the major voucher, relegating our local challengers Stan Gardiner and Kevin Mills into second and third place. Danny O'Hearn and Graeme Hodges both had 36 points for fourth and fifth positions.

Kel Harband recorded the best score of the day, 41 points, to comfortably win C Grade. Alan Peacock, Allan Johns, and Ray Fox all scored 39 points for second, third and fourth places, leaving the fifth place voucher for Rick Geissler with 38 points.

Nearest the Pins on the 13th Hole went to Gary Daniels, A Grade, with 31cms; Brian Kennedy, B Grade with 62cms; Allan Peacock, C Grade 78cms.

On the 17th Hole Nearest the Pin winners were: Peter Callingham, A Grade with 275cms; Kevin Jefferies, B Grade with 365cms; Kevin Pearson (just on), C Grade with 2790cms.

Balls were realised for golfer with 31 points, on countback.

Windsor was successful with the challenge, comfortably defeating Maitland 7 to 3.

On Thursday 112 golfers presented themselves for the weekly Stableford Competition.

Andrew Causey was the best of the A Graders with 41 points to easily win the top voucher. Second place went to John Gorsuch with 33 points from Chris Lucas, also with 33 points in third position from Brett Lovett with 32 points.

B Grade went to Matthew Wilcox with 41 points from Jim Sheeley, Brett Taylor and John Janetzki all with 35 points and positions being determined by countback. Timothy Clarke, in C Grade also scored 41 points to claim first place from the old fox, Kelly Rumble on 36 points from Jeremy Lewin, 35 points and John McDean on 34 points.

Nearest the Pins went to Kevin Bower on the 13th for his shot to 44cms and on the 17th to Glenn Randall for his shot to 450cms.

Balls went to 30 points on countback.

In memory of Sunday fields from 30 years ago an incredible 66 golfers turned up for our Stableford Competition, boosted by our Windsor visitors. Likewise, in memory of Sunday scores from years gone by Damien Moon, current Horizons and ex Windsor member, scored an incredible 47 points to take home the major voucher.

Len Moloney scored 43 points for second place from Geoffrey Banting, Windsor, with 40 points, Eileen Roberts 39 points and Gary Banks, Windsor, with 39 points.

Carol Driffield was Nearest the Pin on the 17th with 220cms and Ian Paton Nearest the Pin on the 13th with 74 cms.
